CHAMBER OF MINES DONATES GH¢100, 000 TO GHANA HEALTH SERVICE AND 48 ENGINEERS REGIMENT

The Ghana Chamber of Mines has donated GH¢100, 000 to support relief efforts of the June 3 disaster victims. An amount of GH¢20, 000 was given to the 48 Engineers Regiment to aid the clearing of debris from the floods, while GH¢80, 000 worth of medical supplies was given to the Ghana Health Service for onward distribution to the hospitals to aid in the treatment of victims.

The donation took place at the forecourt of the Ministry of Health on June 17, 2015. Mr. Sulemanu Koney, Chief Executive Officer of the Chamber in the company of Mr. Ahmed Nantogmah, Director of Public Affairs and Environment made the donation on behalf of the Chamber.

The June 3 disaster recorded about 150 deaths in a flood resulting from a downpour and an explosion at the Goil Filling station at the Kwame Nkrumah circle in Accra. The disaster left many people displaced and caused mass destruction of property.

The donation comprised contributions made by some member companies of the Chamber namely: Gold Fields Ghana Limited; Newmont Ghana Gold Limited; AngloGold Ashanti Limited; Golden Star Resources; Chirano Gold Mines; Perseus Mining (Ghana) Limited; and Ghana Manganese Company. Ahead of the donation, other member companies of the Chamber had already made various donations to support the activities of the disaster relief fund.

The mining industry is alive to its responsibilities as a corporate citizen and also responsive to the needs of the nation and the relevant host communities. Indeed some producing members of the Chamber have arrangements where they provide medical supplies to health facilities within the districts they operate on an on-going basis.
